Young women in Kenya and Cameroon live in extreme poverty and violence, hunger and little education force many to sell themselves for mere dollars. Nairobi has one of the highest HIV rates in Africa, with few public resources for treatment, dying from HIV/AIDS is a very real possibility.

In Cameroon, sexual exploitation, prostitution and trafficking is so common that about 30 percent of girls ages twelve to 25 have given birth at least once. Many young pregnant women are forced from their homes, often after rape or domestic abuse. These women are outcasts with nowhere to go – not even to their church.

Lutheran Hour Ministries (LHM) is committed to spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ in these countries. Through ministry centers, LHM reaches out by sharing hope and faith in Jesus, changing the lives of these women both physically and spiritually.

Reaching Rahab, is one of the Christ-centered programs in Kenya making a difference in the lives of women living on the streets or in prison. With this program of counseling and teaching life skills, the cycle of poverty and prostitution is broken and these women are able to become independent and successful. With the sharing of Jesus and God's forgiveness, they also become reconnected to the church.

LORD Jesus, our help and our Redeemer, we implore You to bless our giving, to enable Lutheran Hour Ministries programs to bring hope and help to the young women of Africa caught in a life of prostitution and violence. You have

placed us in families and churches that support us. Grant our mites to multiply and grow that many young women will be enabled to change their life styles and be connected to the church. Amen.



Advent Season and Midweek Devotional Services

The new Church Year and the **Advent season** begins with **Sunday, Dec. 1**. The Advent seasons, made up basically of the four weeks before Christmas, is the winter penitential season to prepare for the celebration of the birth of the King of kings and Savior of us all.

To help mark the specialness of the Advent season, the Christian community offers a series of midweek devotional services to aid in our spiritual focus for the season if Jesus truly is "the reason for the season." Our congregation keeps this tradition by offering Advent midweek devotional services on **Wednesday evenings, Dec. 4th, 11th, and 18th**. The service begins at 7:00 p.m. and lasts about 40 to 45 minutes. As an evening type word and prayer service, the Lord's Supper is not included. Plan this in your December activities to accent the true holiness of the season!

Note: The Advent season brings with it the traditional "**Advent Wreath**." Though there are variations, our church Advent Wreath bears five candles: three blue or purple, one pink and a white one in the center. The four candles are for the four Advent Sundays leading to Dec. 25. Royal Blue or Purple is reflective of preparing for the coming of the King, Pink (lit on the 3rd Sunday) symbolizes "joy" as we are more than half way through the season (also reflective of the lessons for the 3rd Sun. in Advent). The White candle in the middle is the Christmas candle lit on Christmas Day as the other candles are extinguished (can be lit on Christmas Eve).
