### ALL SAINTS DAY, NOV. 1, OBSERVED SUN. NOV. 3

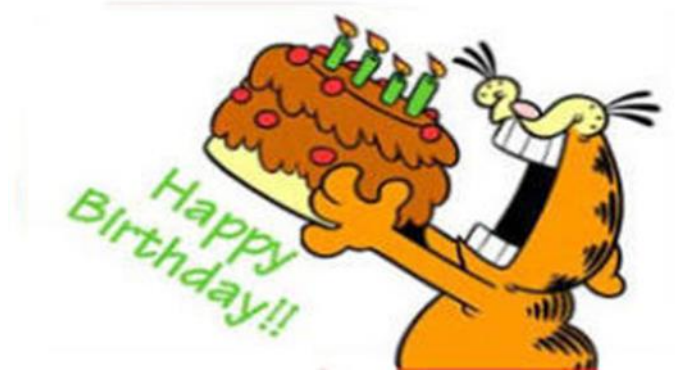
*"Precious in the sight of the LORD is the death of his saints."* Psalm 116:15

Traditionally, the Sunday following Reformation Sunday is observed as "All Saints Sunday" (officially Nov. 1). What beautiful hymns we have in our hymnal to praise and thank God for the faithful and steadfast who have gone before us - those who have, often in the face of great tribulation/persecution, passed the truth of God's Word and saving Gospel of Jesus Christ from one generation to the next. Note: The ESV translation displays 80 verses (O.T. and N.T.) with the term "saints" that comes from the Latin transliteration for "holy ones". These verses actually reference those living, not the deceased. We can only be saints, "holy ones" in the here and now through the righteousness and grace of Christ, in other words, a true saint is a forgiven sinner!

**Nov. 2nd** is designated as "**All Souls Day**" (in Hispanic culture - "the Day of the Dead") giving opportunity to memorialize our loved ones who now stand in the glory of the Lord's presence. Some congregations take the first Sunday of Nov. to remember fellow members who have passed from this life to the next within the last 12 months.

## MARTIN LUTHER'S BIRTHDAY - SUN., NOV. 10

Dr. Martin Luther was born on Nov. 10, 1483, 536 years ago. Yes, we just came off of marking the beginning of the Reformation, on Reformation Sunday, two Sundays before. So to recall Luther's birth date so soon after may seem slightly redundant, but this year Nov. 10 falls on a Sunday, giving us a sub-theme that day to remember the Reformer and his contribution to the Church.

In the *LSB* hymnal, its index (page 1000) lists twenty-seven hymns attributed to Luther. This is above and beyond his translating the Holy Bible from the original languages (Hebrew and Greek) into the German vernacular (published in 1534, 88 years before the King James English version), his Large and Small Catechisms, his many lectures and commentaries on the Bible preserved in the 50+ volumes known as "Luther's Works", and even much more.

In 1983, the U. S. Postal Service issued a controversial postage stamp marking Luther's 500th birth anniversary. If we can recall the birth dates of G. Washington, A. Lincoln and other secular notables, does it not seem fitting to mark Nov. 10 recalling God's gift to the Church bringing the Church back to the Word of God and the Gospel of Jesus Christ?!

Each year, our calendar gives us three special opportunities to acknowledge and honor our military. They are: 1.) Armed Forces Day/Sunday in May - honoring those *currently* serving in our military; 2.) Memorial Day, (originally "Decoration Day") the last Monday of May - *memorializing* those who have made the ultimate sacrifice in defense of our nation and freedom; and 3.) Veterans Day, Nov. 11, (originally "Armistice Day") providing a time to *honor* those who have served in the U. S. Armed Forces. So, Nov. 10/11, we salute and thank all of you who have worn the uniform of our nation's military. In the name of "the Captain of the Lord's hosts", we sincerely thank you!.

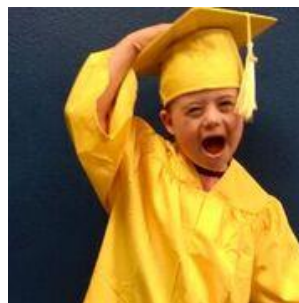

## 2019-2021 LWML Mission Grant #2 Teach Me Too – Preschoolers with Learning Needs - Lutheran Special Education Ministries \$100,000



Lutheran Special Education Ministry (LSEM) has seen a growing desire for early intervention support of children with learning needs. In 2017, LSEM successfully launched entry into preschool education for

exceptional children with learning needs by establishing Let It Shine Academy. This academy was designed to administer those intervention strategies and address the unique needs of children with autism spectrum disorder in an early learning environment. By reaching out and serving these children early in their learning years, they provide tools, strategies, and support to help these learners succeed now and as their education continues. They help them to be successful learners. This preschool creates a place where God's Word can be shared with these children. LSEM is currently directly serving children at 59 schools and churches in 11 states.

Gracious Heavenly Father, all we have is Yours. In thanksgiving and praise, we give You our mission offering that it might, assist in the teaching of the Lutheran Special Education Ministries preschoolers. ## DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME - IST WEEKEND IN NOV.

Like it or not, our state of NM, as do the many, still observes the time change from "daylight savings time" back to "regular standard time". That now happens on the first weekend of November.
