The Psalm for Ash Wednesday, the first day beginning the season called "Lent" is Psalm 51, the "Psalm of David when Nathan the prophet went to him, after he had gone into Bathsheba" (Ps. 51:1 NKJ). Psalm 51 is a Psalm of lament over one's sins and a Psalm of confidence in the Lord's gracious mercy.

King David sinned "against the Lord" (2 Samuel 12:13). When confronted by Nathan the prophet, David could not hide, make excuses, or avoid the truth of what he had done. He was before God—a sinner.

Yet, upon sinners does God have mercy. To sinners is God kind, not in the way of approving sin, nor of looking the other way. Consequences do follow. But such consequences do not mitigate God's Word of forgiveness.

According to the Word of the Lord, forgiveness is gift, not earned or merited. Life everlasting is given, not achieved. Confidence before God of His goodness is not cultivated from within. It is revealed from outside of us, from God to us, made known in the Person of Jesus Christ, God's Son, Who Himself bore "our griefs And carried our sorrows" (Isa. 53:4 NKJ).

This Lententide, we have reason to sorrow and grieve. Sins manifest themselves. Death, the consequence of sin, cannot be avoided. "Weeping may endure for a night, But joy comes in the morning" (Ps. 30:5 NKJ).

The Lord Christ is our Stay, our Confidence, our Peace, our Hope, our sure Refuge, our Joy!

Yes, we do lament our sins and sorrow and grieve. Yet, we do so also in the sure hope of Christ's Word. In Christ, sin is forgiven. In Jesus, death does not have the final word. In Jesus Christ, life is come. Amen.



Lutheran Women's Missionary League Rocky Mountain District Mission Grant #4 - Trinity/HOPE – Filling Haitian Children Spiritually and Physically, \$5,000

Trinity HOPE is a ministry that feeds thousands of hungry children, teachers and cooks each day in Christian schools spread throughout Haiti. This is the only meal nearly 50% of those served will eat in a 24-hour period. Children receive a nutritious bowl of rice (or corn) and beans, with a high-protein mix of tomato paste, dried herring, oil, maggi (seasoning) and water. The special mix was developed by а Vanderbilt University nutritionist. Approximately 62% of Haitians suffer from malnutrition.

Every school Trinity/HOPE feeds is a Christian school, actively teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ on a regular basis. Many schools are tied to the local Christian church.

Approximately 60% of the Haitian population practices Voodoo. Statistics show about 95% of the children fed (physically) and FED (spiritually) through this program come to believe in Jesus Christ. "An empty stomach has no ears" is a wellphrase in Haiti. Trinitv/HOPE known understands that when children are SO hungry they can't concentrate, their education suffers. Haiti's future depends on the education of the upcoming generation; 48% of Haitians over the age of 15 are illiterate. To date there are 128 schools that are being fed and FED. Since 1999 when the program began, no school once it has begun this ministry has had its feeding program discontinued.

This grant of \$5,000 from Lutheran Women's Missionary League Rocky Mountain District combined with grants from 5 other LWML districts provide a noon meal for 345 souls at First Lutheran School of Les Cayes, Haiti, for a two year period. 100% of funds from these 6 districts are used for the feeding program at this school.
